# THE FIRST TO RISE FROM THE DEAD



Jesus our Master, our Saviour, Leader and Bridegroom - was also "the first to rise from the dead." This Discovery Lesson will investigate the resurrection of Jesus. How was he the 'first'? Does being 'the first' imply that others will follow? Is his resurrection the same or different from what God has promised to us? Was his actual physical body raised, or something new created?

Below are other passages that speak of Jesus being the FIRST to rise. List any helpful details.

" so I stand here saying nothing but what <b>the prophets and Moses said would come to pass</b> : that the Christ must suffer and that, by being the <b>first to rise from the dead,</b> he would proclaim light both to our people and to the Gentiles." (Acts 26:22-23 NIV)	
" Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth." (Revelation 1:5)	
"And to the angel of the church in Laodicean write: 'The words of the Amen, the faithful and true witness, <b>the beginning of God's creation."</b> (Revelation 3:14)	
"And he is the head of the body, the church. <b>He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead</b> , that in everything he might be preeminent." (Colossians 1:18)

All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself"  (2 Corinthians 5:17-19)	
"But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For neither circumcision counts for anything, nor uncircumcision, but <b>a new creation.</b> " (Galatians 6:14-15)	
"Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is <b>born again</b> he cannot see the kingdom of God." Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is <b>born of water and the Spirit,</b> he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit." (John 3:3-6)

#### THE FIRST TO RISE FROM THE DEAD

How was Jesus the FIRST to rise from the dead? There were several miraculous resurrections in the Old Testament, and Jesus himself raised 2 men and a young lady. Was there a way in which his resurrection to life was different than all those that came before?

The following passage from Romans 6 helps to answers these questions.

"For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God." (Romans 6:7-10)

# THE FIRSTBORN AMONG MANY BROTHERS

Will our resurrection be like the resurrection of Jesus Christ?

For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ."  (1 Corinthians 15:20-23)	
"Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that <b>when he appears we shall be like him,</b> because we shall see him as he is." (1 John 3:2)	
"If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers." ### WHAT PART OF JESUS WAS RAISED?

If we are to be raised like Jesus was, it is helpful to understand his resurrection. Was his literal earthly body raised? Or was there a part of him that was raised? Or did some part of him leave his dead body? The following verses specifically answer these questions:

The Jews then said, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and will you raise it up in three days?" But he was speaking about the temple of his body. (John 2:18-22)	
" this Jesus God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it. For David says concerning him, "I saw the Lord always before me, for he is at my right hand that I may not be shaken; therefore my heart was glad, and my tongue rejoiced; my flesh also will dwell in hope. For you will not abandon my soul to Hades, or let your Holy One see corruption "Brothers, I may say to you with confidence about the patriarch David that he both died and was buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. Being therefore a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him that he would set one of his descendants on his throne, he foresaw and spoke about the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to Hades, nor did his flesh see corruption. This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses." (Acts 2:22-32 - QUOTE FROM PSALM 16:9-10) (FOR 'witnesses' see Acts 1:1-4)	
"And as for the fact that he raised him from the dead, no more to return to corruption, he has spoken in this way "'You will not let your Holy One see corruption.' For David, after he had served the purpose of God in his own generation, fell asleep and was laid with his fathers and saw corruption, but he whom God raised up did not see corruption."
