

What is the difference between all the Bible Translations?

Some translations are very **LITERAL** – 'word for word', and are therefore more accurate to the original Hebrew and Greek texts. However, these translations are generally less 'easy' to read.

Some are **DYNAMIC** – which means they practise 'thought for thought' to try and give the meaning of the original languages. This often makes for a much easier to read translation, but the accuracy may suffer.

Some are **PARAPHRASES** – where the translator has put the text into his own words. This is the least accurate translation. A paraphrase often is easy to read, but doctrinal bias of the translator can lead to major doctrinal errors.



Consider this comparison of 3 Translations of Genesis 6:1-4

And it came to pass, when men began to multiply on the face of the earth, and daughters were born unto them, ² That **the sons of God** saw the daughters of men that they were fair; and they took them wives of all which they chose. ³ And the LORD said, My spirit shall not always strive with man, for that he also is flesh: yet his days shall be an hundred and twenty years. ⁴ There were giants in the earth in those days; and also after that, when **the sons of God** came in unto the daughters of men, and they bare children to them, the same became mighty men which were of old, men of renown. (KJV)

From reading the KJV, who do you think married the beautiful women?

When human beings began to increase in number on the earth and daughters were born to them, ² the sons of God saw that the daughters of humans were beautiful, and they married any of them they chose. ³ Then the LORD said, "My Spirit will not contend with^[a] humans forever, for they are mortal; their days will be a hundred and twenty years." ⁴ The Nephilim were on the earth in those days—and also afterward—when the sons of God went to the daughters of humans and had children by them. They were the heroes of old, men of renown. (NIV)

From reading the NIV who do you think married the beautiful women?

Now a population explosion took place upon the earth. It was at this time that **beings from the spirit world** looked upon the beautiful earth women and took any they desired to be their wives. ³ Then Jehovah said, "My Spirit must not forever be disgraced in man, wholly evil as he is. I will give him 120 years to mend his ways." ⁴ In those days, and even afterwards, when **the evil beings from the spirit** world were sexually involved with human women, their children became giants, of whom so many legends are told. (LB)

From reading the LB who do you think married the beautiful women?

To determine which translation is right, let's look at this passage more carefully using Bible study tools: **CONTEXT**

Genesis 4 begins with Cain killing Abel, and then establishing his own family line with many descendants who developed their skills in music, farming, weaponry and built cities – but were not godly-minded. In fact a man named Lamach boast that he would kill anyone who crosses him. However, the chapter ends with, "And as for Seth, to him also a son was born; and he named him Enosh. Then men began to call on the name of the LORD."

Two sides develop soon after creation – those who worshipped God, and those who lived for themselves.

Note: These 'giants' – 'nephiyl' were in the earth after the flood had wiped out everyone except Noah's family. Whatever happened in Genesis 6 either happened again, or was part of the human genetic code of the 8 people on the ark.

"And Jesus answered and said to them, "The sons of this age marry and are given in marriage. 35 "But those who are counted	

worthy to attain that age, and the resurrection from the dead, neither marry nor are given in marriage; 36 "nor can they die anymore, for they are equal to the angels and are sons of God, being sons of the resurrection." (Luke 6:34-36)
